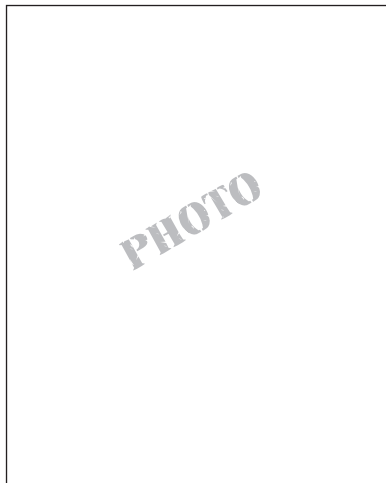

Emergency Procedure for Anaphylaxis

1. Act quickly – give epinephrine immediately
2. Stay with pupil and send someone for help
3. Call 911 and use the word “Anaphylaxis”
4. Go to hospital and stay for observation

EARLY RECOGNITION OF SYMPTOMS AND IMMEDIATE TREATMENT COULD SAVE A PERSON'S LIFE

OBSERVABLE SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

ASTHMATIC REACTIONS

- accelerated breathing rate, obvious discomfort, breathlessness, tightened neck muscles, lips/nails greyish or bluish colour

DIABETIC REACTIONS

- sudden cold/clammy/sweaty skin, trembling, confusion, irritability, unco-ordinated staggering gait, difficulty speaking, fainting, unconsciousness, (thirsty, dry skin, nausea, vomiting, fruity odour to breath)

SEIZURES/CONVULSIONS

- violent jerking of the body, unusual movements, unconsciousness, shaking, convulsions, repetitive movements, frothing, biting, incoherent speech

ALLERGIC REACTIONS (ANAPHYLAXIS)

SKIN

- hives, swelling, itching, warmth, redness, rash

RESPIRATORY (BREATHING)

- wheezing, shortness of breath, throat tightness, cough, hoarse voice, chest pain/tightness, nasal congestion or hay fever-like symptoms (runny itchy nose and watery eyes, sneezing) trouble swallowing

GASTROINTESTINAL (STOMACH)

- nausea, pain/cramps, vomiting, diarrhea

CARDIOVASCULAR (HEART)

- pale/blue colour, weak pulse, passing out, dizzy/lightheaded, shock

OTHER

- anxiety, feeling of "impending doom", headache
