Children & Youth Services

Community Living Campbellford/Brighton (CLC/B) offers 24 hour Respite Support AND Individual Residential Care for children and youth.

Who is eligible for these services?

Children & Youth Services are available to people under 18 years of age who have an intellectual disability.



Respite Support

Respite Support Services provide planned short-term and time-limited breaks for unpaid caregivers of children with an intellectual disability.

This service gives caregivers a break from their regular responsibilities, a chance to re-energize, and an opportunity to pursue their own interests.

What Respite Support options are available?

Child and Youth Respite Support is offered in a separate designated area of the Community Homes located in Campbellford and Cobourg. Guests using Respite Support can look forward to the comfort and security of a beautiful home setting and the opportunity to try something new and exciting based on personal choice and interest.

Respite Services at Community Living Campbellford/Brighton are available through government-funded programs AND on a fee-for-service basis.

Costs include accommodation, meals, mileage and recreation expenses (if desired) during the stay.



Individual Residential Care

Sometimes it is not possible for children and youth with an intellectual disability to live at home. A negotiated *Individual Residential Care* agreement is made with the natural family for the child to live in an associate home setting that is based on individual circumstances and the support required.

Individual Residential Care provides a range of services from basic accommodation, care and supervision to specialized programs for children and youth with complex needs or who are medically fragile.

Community Services



Foundations

The Foundations program helps young people transition successfully from school to adulthood and develop skills that will help them achieve their career, volunteer and community participation goals. It is for young adults with a developmental disability who are in school or who have left school and need support in creating a plan for the future.

Services available through Foundations:

<u>Resource Hub</u> – supports families in navigating developmental services, holds public information sessions at least 2 times per year, and connects people to resources for accessing funding, community programs, respite, and other government and community services.

<u>Life After School Planning</u> – a resource for individualized transitional planning and supports young adults in exploring personal interests, identifying goals, developing skills, overcoming barriers and building a meaningful future.

People can apply to receive ministry funded support through contacting DSO (Developmental Services Ontario).





I will be holding a community dialogue to gather input on the accessibility legislation being developed by my colleague the Hon. Carla Qualtrough, Minister of Sport and Persons with Disabilities. This dialogue will also assist my office with ensuring that we take a more inclusive approach to the services we offer to the people of Peterborough-Kawartha and will assist me in representing your interests in Ottawa.

The dialogue will be a participatory event, and those in attendance will be asked to share their thoughts on the following questions:

- What are some examples of when you have felt included and fully able to participate in our community?
- What activities or opportunities are you unable to participate in? What prevents your participation?
- What issues or barriers should the law cover?
- What is the best way to get people and organizations to follow the law?
- How can the government raise awareness, change attitudes and show leadership to increase inclusion, participation and equality of opportunity?

All residents of Peterborough-Kawartha are welcome to attend. We especially look forward to hearing from people living with disabilities, their families, caregivers, and supporting organizations

Coping With the World at Large - Assisting Individuals with ASD in the Community January 27, 2017 - DURHAM

This workshop will explore various strategies and resources to assist individuals on the spectrum when taken out and about in the community. We will look at a structured approach to pre-planning for such outings. In the afternoon, participants will then use the knowledge and strategies from the first part of the workshop to develop a plan for an outing for the individual they are involved with.

Social Communication Therapy for children with ASD February 7, 2017 - DURHAM

This workshop is designed to provide participants with an overview of the social communication challenges that children with ASD typically face, therapy techniques that can build social communication skills, and the benefits of group therapy versus individual therapy.

Teaching Understanding & Acceptance of an ASD Diagnosis February 17, 2017 - DURHAM

Knowing you are different but not understanding why can create an enormous amount of stress on an individual. This workshop will examine the why, when and how individuals on the spectrum should be educated about their ASD diagnosis. We will also discuss self advocacy.
