

You will be able to participate in the group virtually, using video conferencing to connect with the group facilitators and other participants.





Years of Making Dreams Come True

Dear Special Education Superintendent:

I am contacting you on behalf of the Down Syndrome Association of Peterborough and its' members regarding some serious concerns surrounding under-staffing of supply Support Staff in your Board.

It has come to our attention that the Peterborough Victoria Northumberland and Clarington Catholic District School Board has an on-going, chronic issue with support staff positions going unfilled when absences of regular support staff take place. The result of these vacancies is our children not engaging in the programming which is set out for them or, in some cases, not receiving the support levels they require, resulting in situations which raise serious safety concerns. Clearly, both of these circumstances are unacceptable, creating liability issues for your Board and infringing on the rights of our children in accordance with the Ontario Code of Human Rights.

It is hoped that your Board has a strategy prepared to remedy this circumstance in an expedient manner, and we look forward to hearing what those plans might be.
