THEORY OF ACTION

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Definition



Looks Like: Helping a friend, holding the door for someone, smiling at a stranger, complimenting someone, picking up someone else's pencil, sharing a special treat with someone who has forgotten, helping someone without being asked.



Sounds Like: Giving someone a compliment, using your manners, offering to help, laughter, saying thank you, asking others to join in, and happy voices.



Feels Like: Warm and fuzzy, inclusive, right and just, comfort, goodness.

Traditional Prayers of the Month



Corinthians 13.1-13

If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing. Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

Non Eucharistic Symbols

Crucifix: Symbol of injustice suffered by Jesus who was nailed to the cross and left to die. It reminds us to be just and kind in our dealings with others.

Spring Flowers / Seeds: To symbolize our longing for growth, renewal and spring.

Food Drive Item: To symbolize our willingness to show kindness in taking care of others.

A Paper Heart: To symbolize the love that Jesus has for us.

A reading from the book of Samuel.

Second Reading (Optional) Ruth 2.1-20

Naomi had a relative named Boaz, a rich and influential man who belonged to the family of her husband Elimelech. One day Ruth said to Naomi, "Let me go to the fields to gather the corn that the harvest workers leave. I am sure to find someone who will let me work with him." Naomi answered, "Go ahead, my daughter." So Ruth went out to the fields and walked behind the workers, picking up the corn which they left. It so happened that she was in a field that belonged to Boaz. Sometime later Boaz himself arrived from Bethlehem and greeted his workers. "The Lord be with you!" he said. "The Lord bless you!" they answered. Boaz asked the man in charge, "Who is that young woman?" The man answered, "She is the foreign girl who game back from Moab with Naomi. She asked me to let her follow the workers and pick up the corn. She has been working since early morning and has just now stopped to rest for a while under the shelter." Then Boaz said to Ruth, "Let me give you some advice. Don't pick up corn anywhere except in this field. Work with the women here; watch them to see where they are reaping and stay with them. I have ordered my men not to hurt you. And whenever you are thirsty, go and drink from the water jars that they have filled." Ruth bowed down with her face touching the ground, and said to Boaz, "Why should you be so concerned about me? Why should you be so kind to a foreigner?" Boaz answered, "I have heard everything that you have done for your mother-in-law since your husband died. I know how you left your father and mother and your own country and how you came to live among a people you had never known before. May the Lord reward you for what you have done. May you have a full reward from the Lord God of Israel, to whom you have come for protection!" Ruth answered, "You are very kind to me sir. You have made me feel better by speaking gently to me, even though I am one of your servants."

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

"But I tell you who hear me: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, and pray for those who ill-treat you. If anyone hits you on one cheek, let him hit the other one too; if someone takes your coat, let him have your shirt as well. Give to everyone who asks you for something, and when someone takes what is yours, do not ask for it back. Do for others just what you want them to do for you.

If you love only the people who love you, why should you receive a blessing? Even sinners love those who love them! And if you do good only to those who do good to you, why should you receive a blessing? Even sinners do that! And if you lend only to those from whom you hope to get it back, why should you receive a blessing? Even sinners lend to sinners, to get back the same amount! No! Love your enemies and do good to them; lend and expect nothing back. You will then have a great reward, and you will be sons of the Most High God. For he is good to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful just as your Father is merciful.

Optional Activities

The Golden Rule: Have children draw pictures showing examples of the Golden Rule.

Acts of Kindness: Have students write on a piece of paper an act of kindness that they hope to fulfill during the month of February. Present acts of kindness intentions during non-Eucharistic celebration.

Alphabetical Kindness List: Have students co-create an alphabetical list of easy kindness activities together. Present this list during celebration.

Dear God.

After listening to your word and hearing stories of kindness, we have learned that being kind even to our enemies can be the greatest reward of all. Help us be active witnesses to kindness in our own lives through our words, actions and interactions with others. We are the key ingredient to developing a more kind and tolerant world. o Create your own valentine 'conversation hearts.' Instead of love messages, use biblical quotes to create 'God's conversation hearts.'






