Welcome...

Welcome to the Peterborough Victoria Northumberland and Clarington Catholic District School Board's Secondary Summer School Program 2019.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Secondary Summer School will offer 4 types of programs:

1. **E-LEARNING FULL CREDIT COURSE** – 110 hours to be completed by the end of 4 weeks.
2. **GRADE 9-12 NUMERACY REMEDIATION** for Grades 9 and 10 math and **CREDIT RECOVERY** for senior math courses. The summer school math program is offered in a classroom setting during the first two weeks of July. Students must be referred for this program by the Student Success Team at their home school. Numeracy Remediation and Credit Recovery are only available to students who were not successful in achieving a credit in the math course they completed.
3. **TRANSFER COURSE** – MPM1H Math Transfer Course is a foundational half credit for students who have successfully completed Grade 9 MFM1P and require the math prerequisite for the academic Grade 10 math course MPM2D.
4. **COOPERATIVE EDUCATION** – The Summer School Coop Program is available only to PVNCCDSB students. A **paper application** is required in conjunction with a resume and WEA agreement. All documentation along with the Coop application are to be sent to summerschool@pvnccdsb.on.ca prior to June 21, 2019. Please contact the Guidance Department at your home school for the Coop Link Course required in the application.

The Coop program delivers the course content online through the D2L system. Students are required to complete the module component on line. Students must have a placement in place prior to the start of the program and the placement must fulfill the hour requirements as follows:

110 hours 1 credit – July 2 – July 29, 2019 (4 weeks)

Preplacement and integration modules are assigned to July 2 and July 3 and two face to face meetings with the Coop teacher are required for the program.

220 hours 2 credits – July 2 – August 16, 2019 (7 weeks)

Preplacement and integration modules are assigned to July 2 – July 5 and four face to face meetings with the Coop teacher are required for the program.

REGISTRATION BEGINS TUESDAY, APRIL 23, 2019

Registration must be completed online at <http://apps.pvnccdsb.on.ca/SummerSchoolRegistration/> with the exception of COOP which requires a paper application.

Note: If you are a student NOT from PVNCCDSB, after registering online, you must send a copy of your transcript, and IEP (if applicable), to summerschool@pvnccdsb.on.ca

All summer school registrations will be confirmed by your Guidance Office to validate course selection and pre-requisites.

Online Registration closes June 27 at 4:00 p.m.

Please note: No Coop Applications will be considered after June 15, 2019.

Note: Students will receive a final confirmation of registration by email.

Registration forms must also be printed from the online registration site, signed by a parent/guardian, and submitted on the first day of class or for online courses through the orientation session drop box prior to the start of class.

ATTENDANCE FOR CLASSROOM PROGRAMS

Students are expected to arrive on time, and to attend every day.

Note: If a student is late four (4) times by more than 15 minutes, it will count as one (1) day absent unless contact is made with the Principal of Summer School.

A student will be removed from, and fail to receive an evaluation for, any course in which she/he has been absent for any reason for more than two (2) days in a 2 week session.

ATTENDANCE FOR ONLINE COURSES

Students are expected to log into their class daily. Students are expected to meet the deadline submissions for all assignments.

LUNCH FOR CLASSROOM PROGRAMS

Students are expected to bring a lunch, snacks, and drinks to summer school.

(Please be aware that some sites may have dietary restrictions if allergies to certain foods are present)

MATERIALS

On the first day of a face-to-face class, a \$25 deposit may be required for resources which will be refunded at the end of the program. Cheques can be made out to PVNCCDSB. All supplies and textbooks are loaned to students for the duration of Summer School only. The deposit will only be cashed if resources are lost or damaged, and the student will be billed for the remaining cost.

DRESS CODE

Students are expected to dress for summer learning. If a student is inappropriately dressed he/she will be sent home to get changed. Uniforms are not required.

Note: Each school site is air conditioned.

BUS TRANSPORTATION

Note: Since public transit is available within each of the host school's urban areas (i.e. City of Peterborough, City of Kawartha Lakes, Bowmanville) transportation is not provided to students residing in these areas and therefore, is the family's responsibility.

Exams are written: Monday, July 15, 2019

Exams will NOT be written at any other time.

Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course exam to be written July 26, 2019.

Full Disclosure – Students have until Monday, July 22, 2019 at 9:00 a.m. to withdraw from a course, and by 9:00 a.m. on the sixth (6th) day of classes for senior credit recovery courses. After this date/time, senior credit course attempts will be disclosed on the student's transcript.

Final reports for Summer School will be mailed to the home address and home school in August.
