

*Children/staff who are high-risk contacts (HRC) of a positive COVID-19 case will receive a letter from Public Health with guidance and directions.

Purpose: To be used when anyone in the household is told by Public Health that they are a high-risk contact of a confirmed COVID-19 case. All HRC must quarantine immediately. Quarantine means to stay home.

| If HRC individual <u>has symptoms</u> | If HRC individual does not have symptoms | If HRC individual tests positive for COVID-19 |
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| HRC must stay home and quarantine for 14 days from last contact with positive case. HRC should go for COVID-19 testing immediately. Follow the direction in the letter from Public Health about when they can return to school/childcare/work. Must be able to pass screening tool before returning. Any household members of a symptomatic HRC must also quarantine until test results return for symptomatic individual. | HRC must remain home and quarantine for 14 days from last contact with positive case. HRC is recommended to be tested for COVID- 19 on or after day 7 of quarantine period. Follow the direction in the letter from Public Health about when they can return to school/childcare/work. Must be able to pass screening tool before returning. Household members of a HRC should remain at home except for <u>essential reasons</u> such as going to school, childcare or work, until the quarantine period is over. | HRC who tested positive for COVID-19 must follow directions from Public Health (i.e. self-isolate for 10 days from symptom onset [or test date]). Any household members of a HRC who tests positive for COVID-19 quarantine for 14 days from last contact with the individual who tested positive. Household members are recommended to go for a COVID-19 test immediately, and if receive a negative test result, recommended to re-test on or after day 10 of isolation. |
