Advent Wreath: To symbolize the four weeks of waiting for the birth of Jesus.

Unopened Gift: To remind us that good things come to those who wait.

Empty Crèche: To symbolize the anticipation of Jesus' birth.



Opening Prayer Gathering

Old Testament Reading Isaiah 7.1-2; 6-7

A reading from the book of Isaiah.

Once upon a time, everyone lived in the dark, but now they can see. They used to live in a world that was full of shadows, but now we have a light to light up our way. We have God with us, and he has made us happy. He has sent us a child who is to be our King, and he will keep everyone safe.

The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.







Responsorial Psalm Psalm 37

The response to the psalm is "Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for him."

Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for him; Do not fret over those who prosper in their way, over those who carry out evil devices. $\mathcal R$

Refrain from anger and forsake wrath. Do not fret, it leads only to evil for the wicked should be cut off But those who wait for the Lord, should inherit the Land. $\mathcal R$

Yet a little while, and the wicked will be no more; Though you look diligently for their place, they will not be there. But the meek should inherit the land, and delight themselves in abundant prosperity. \mathcal{R}



Second Reading (Optional)

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Hebrews.

When God made a promise to Abraham, because he had no one greater by whom to swear, he swore by himself, saying, "I will surely bless you and multiply you." And thus Abraham, [having patiently endured, obtained the promise. Human beings, of course, swear by someone greater than themselves, and an oath given as confirmation puts an end to all dispute. In the same way, when God desired to show even more clearly to the heirs of the promise the unchangeable character of his purpose, he guaranteed it by an oath, so that through two unchangeable things, in which it is impossible that God would prove false, we who have taken refuge might be strongly encouraged to seize the hope set before us. We have this hope, a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters the inner shrine behind the curtain, where Jesus, a forerunner on our behalf, has entered, having become a high priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke.

In the sixth month, the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth and said to Mary, the fiancée of Joseph:

"Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you,"

She was puzzled by his words and wondered what this greeting meant.

The angel said to her: "Do not be afraid. You will give birth to a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be called the Son of the Most High. He will rule the house of Jacob forever."

Mary wondered how this could be, and the angel told her;

"The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the child will be holy. He will be called the Son of God." Then, the angel left her and returned to heaven.




