Bravery is represented by the bear. The mother bear has the courage and strength to face her fears and challenges while protecting her young. The bear also shows us how to live a balanced life with rest, survival and play.

Find your inner strength to face the difficulties of life and the courage to be yourself. Defend what you believe in and what is right for your community, family and self. Make positive choices and have conviction in your decisions. Face your fears to allow yourself to live your life.

#### S Opening Prayer Gathering

#### Dear Lord,

We gather today to celebrate modesty. The world teaches that we must please others in order to be popular. Teach us by your example to instill into others a real respect for modesty and purity. Allow us to celebrate our faith in You as we gather together today. Grant that others may see in us reason to change their ways, if that be necessary, and that we may have the courage to resist any temptation to sinful conduct. Let others be led closer to Jesus by our example.

Amen.

#### Old Testament Reading Exodus 28.40-42

A reading from the book of Exodus.

For Aaron's sons you shall make tunics and sashes and headdresses; you shall make them for their glorious adornment. You shall put them on your brother Aaron, and on his sons with him, and shall anoint them and ordain them and consecrate them so that they may serve me as priests. You shall make for them linen undergarments to cover their naked flesh; they shall reach from the hips to the thighs; Aaron and his sons shall wear them when they go into the tent of meeting, or when they come near the altar to minister in the holy place; or they will bring guilt on themselves and die. This shall be a perpetual ordinance for him and for his descendants after him.

The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.





#### Responsorial Psalm Psalm 1.1-6

The response to the psalm is "Happy are those who take delight in the law of the Lord."

Happy are those who do not follow the advice of the wicked, or take the path that sinners tread, or sit in the seat of scoffers; but their delight is in the law of the Lord.  $\mathcal R$ 

And on his law they meditate day and night. They are like trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season, and their leaves do not wither. In all that they do, they prosper.  $\mathcal{R}$ 

The wicked are not so, but are like chaff that the wind drives away. Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgement, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous; for the Lord watches over the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.  $\mathcal{R}$ 

#### Second Reading (Optional) 1 Timothy 2.8-11

A reading from the first letter of Timothy.

I desire, then, that in every place the men should pray, lifting up holy hands without anger or argument; also that the women should dress themselves modestly and decently in suitable clothing, not with their hair braided, or with gold, pearls, or expensive clothes, but with good works, as is proper for women who profess reverence for God.

The word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

#### 1 Corinthians 3.16-18

Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person. For God's temple is holy and you are that temple. Do not deceive yourselves. If you think that you are wise in this age, you should become fools so that you may become wise.

The word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.



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#### 5 Gospel Reading Matthew 6.1-4

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

"Beware of practicing your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven. "So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your alms may be done in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

The Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you Lord, Jesus Christ.

#### S Optional Activities

**Modest Body Collage** – Trace around children's body, use scraps of fabric, paper to create modest clothes for the body outline. The same could be done in a smaller size on paper dolls too.

**Compliment Cards** – Have students write their name in the middle of a piece of paper. Students can then rotate around the cards and write a compliment about other students in the class.

#### Closing Prayer

#### Dear Lord,

Teach us that God must be our first love and that all other love is based on Him and Him alone. Help us to remember that our bodies and the bodies of all in grace are temples of the Holy Spirit, destined someday for a glorious resurrection.

Through your beautiful example, teach us the value and dignity of Christian modesty. Grant that we may never be the occasion of dragging others into bad situations, by suggestive words or wrongful deeds of any kind. Remind us to not draw attention to ourselves and remind us to be orderly, quiet and humble in our speech, behavior and dress.
