

# **Prayer Service / Non Eucharistic Liturgy**



### Non Eucharistic Symbols

Lamb: A symbol of gentle obedience and trust in God, as well as a symbol of Jesus, who humbly sacrificed his life for us.

An Image of Mary: Mary is a model of gentle, yet courageous faith. She willingly submitted to the will of God, became the mother of Jesus as well as our Heavenly Mother.

Feather: A feather reminds us to be gentle in our words and actions. We look to the examples of Mary and Jesus when we interact with our classmates, our colleagues, our families and indeed everyone we meet.



### **Opening Prayer** Gathering

Dear Lord.

By the example of Mary, the Mother of God, we learn how to follow Jesus. She is the first and greatest disciple, because she believed and trusted in God's promise to her. Mary's gentle nature guides us as we develop this fruit of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Today, let us focus on gentleness and the wonderful example of Mary, Our Mother.



## Old Testament Reading

A reading from the book of Isaiah.

He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms, and carry them in his arms, and gently lead the mother sheep.

The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.







In the Hail Mary, we use one title for Mary – Holy Mary, Mother of God. Over the centuries people have also given Mary other titles that tell us why she is important in their lives. Let's hear some of them now as we ask Mary to Intercede for us with God. After the reader speaks each title, please say, "Pray for us."
